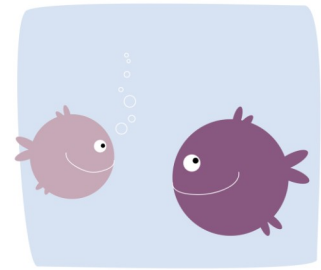

One of Alexander's pals is Dylan. They both will have tummy time together. Sometime they sit, with a little help, in front of the

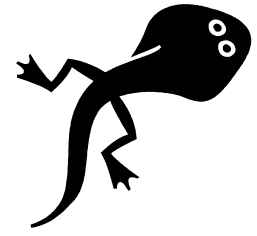

Hannah and Lila are always busy. They love to dance and move with the rhythm of the music. They love to dance together but are still learning how to share their toys with each other!

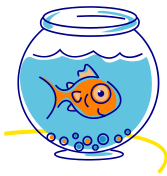
Clarabelle is a very sweet girl. She loves to listen to music and dance. Also, she loves to study all of the pictures in our books. She is always up for a walk outside.

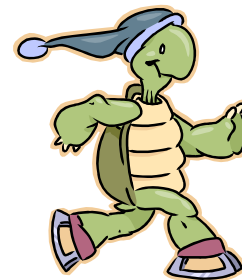
Turtles

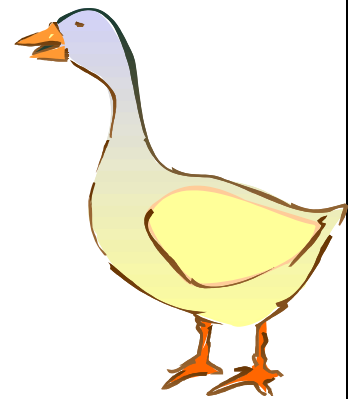

Can you believe that it's already August? This summer has flown by!

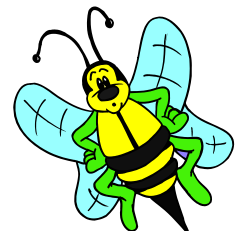

Parking Reminder



Please help us ensure a safe and orderly traffic pattern in front of our School. We ask you to adjust your routes to come into the office part from Rockledge Drive or Fernwood Road. If you come in from Rock Spring Drive, **please go around the pond rather than try to pull into the drop off spaces facing the wrong way.** Please do not park on the side of the road closest to the pond if there are any other spaces available. Parking on that side causes a very narrow lane for cars to pass through and is potentially hazardous as it severely limits the visibility of children getting into their cars. If there are no available spots in pick-up and drop-off you may:

- 1) Park in one of the visitor spots around the pond and by the playground.
- 2) Park in the new parking garage on the other side of the play areas (Park up to 20 minutes for free)
- 3) Wait for a space to become open.

****Remember, in order to park in the drop off area, you need to display a Rock Spring bumper sticker to avoid getting towed****

Board Update

The Board recently worked with the directors to update the Parent Handbook for the coming year. One big change was the removal of activity fees. For 2010-2011, activities such as Music and Movement, summer spirit days, and Field Trips will be included in the cost of tuition.

Another big change was the addition of the concept of "community" to our mission statement. The new mission statement reads as follows:

The mission of our program is to provide quality, loving, licensed childcare and pre-school education for infants through five year olds as a nonprofit service to local families. We provide a carefully planned, stimulating program for the cognitive, physical, social and emotional development of young children in a safe, clean, and nurturing environment so that they are thoroughly equipped for kindergarten and beyond. Our teacher, directors, and families work together to create a supportive community in which our children learn and thrive.

The concept of community is a fundamental

part of our school. It was community spirit that allowed us to come together two years ago to save the school and build the great facility we have today. It is the community spirit that we see every day with the special relationships that are fostered between teachers, children, and parents. It is also this community spirit that will allow us to overcome any other challenges we may face.

One such challenge has been the parking situation. While most in our community understand the need for safe and orderly traffic rules in the drop off area, some have failed to alter their behavior. We're pleased to announce that "Do Not Enter" signs will still go up in front of the drop off lane to help promote the correct traffic patterns. Also, in order to ensure that our community is safe and is made up of those families who value it, we will be terminating enrollment of those families who do not follow school policies such as our parking policy. We're hopeful that with the new signs and the continued communication we have been having on this issue, all of our parents will conclude that it is better to follow the rules than to be excluded from this incredible community.

All paperwork needs to be turned into the office by August 31st. This is a licensing requirement, so yes, you have to fill out the same paperwork that you filled out last year! If you enrolled at RSCC in August 2010 or later, you will not be required to fill out the paperwork again.

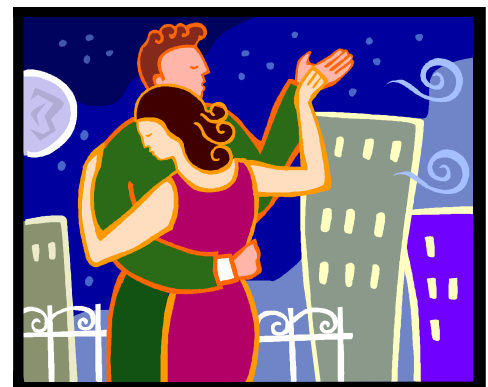
