COVID at-home and on-site testing tips (updated 1/24/2022)

N95 mask

- Per <u>CDC</u> mask guideline, N95/KN95 and surgical masks offer more protection than loosely fitting cloth masks.
- Online purchase: <u>Amazon;</u> <u>CVS</u>
- Free giveaway at MC libraries: <u>check local public libraries</u> and some give out N95 at the same time as rapid test distribution

At-Home Rapid tests:

- Online purchase: <u>Amazon</u> (e.g., ihealth available now); <u>Walmart</u> (e.g., Abbott in and out of stock); <u>Walgreens</u>; <u>ihealth.com</u>; <u>Hillcrest Pharmacy</u>
- Tips: order a couple boxes each week for the following week; supplies should begin to increase next week and we should see faster delivery times; check in the early mornings
- Free giveaway at MC libraries: <u>check local public libraries</u> for specific time for kit and N95 mask distribution.
- The Federal Government will mail each household 4 test kits if you request them on this site: <u>Covidtests.gov</u>.
- Most insurance companies will reimburse you for COVID tests. Check with your insurance company for details.

On-site test:

• Start with your pediatric office: they will want to document the case.

- <u>PM Pediatrics in Rockville</u> has had same day appointments available with results coming back within 24 hours
- <u>Capitol Medical Group Pediatrics</u> does free drive up testing at 7am most weekday mornings with same day results usually available before noon. (Your children must be patients there).
- Other testing sites: <u>county-organized</u>; private ones like <u>Same</u> <u>Day Testing</u>

At-home test (for a service fee):

- <u>Same day testing house call</u> : \$ 25/person for nurse coming to your home for a PCR. This can be a good routine check so you don't have to wait with your kids in doctors' office
 - Don't pay 75\$ for priority. Usual turnaround is ~24 hours for results even for non-priority test
 - You can schedule in advance for a weekend test and cancel or reschedule up to 2 hours before your appointment
 - If desired, parents could use a service such as this each week to comply with the weekly surveillance testing.
 - A lab based PCR test such as this could be done up to
 2 days before the child starts each week at RSCC.
 - For example, if the child will attend Monday, the PCR could be conducted as early as Saturday morning, If results aren't back in time, just do a rapid test in the morning before coming to the School.
 - If available, children under 2 could use this method rather than having parents test.
